Evidence Summaries - getting judges a quick overview of procedural history, legal and factual issues at play in a specific case

Talking to the Evidence

Making it possible to have detailed "conversations" with the evidence, to find out specific matters that may be in the evidence (e.g. how often did Alex write to Bill about the proposed licensing agreement between Shady Inc and Dodgy LLC?).

Scheduling Cases

Smart(er) Scheduling of Cases to take into account predictions as to pre-trial settlement, adjournments, or specialised lists of judges (e.g. find 5 continuous days before a Judge on List 9, in Nov 2024, even if the Judge has been scheduled to hear another case, so long as she has not started hearing that case yet).

Helping Unrepresented Litigants prepare for Oral Hearings

Will unrepresented litigants benefit from Gen AI helping them organise their thoughts and materials to prepare their attendance at oral hearings? The litigants will have to be responsible for checking the comprehensiveness of what Gen AI has prepared, and there will have to be disclaimers.

Helping Judges Prepare Draft Judgments

If a Judge has decided in favour of Alice and not Bob, might Gen AI help the Judge prepare a Draft Judgment, perhaps with the Judge informing the Large Language Model what are the key elements that led to her decision? The Judge remains responsible for vetting the Draft.

Access-to-Justice: Chatbot

How might we use Gen AI to provide citizens with relevant information pertaining to their specific situation? Are chatbots the "answer" or some combination of chatbots and more traditional curated purpose written content?

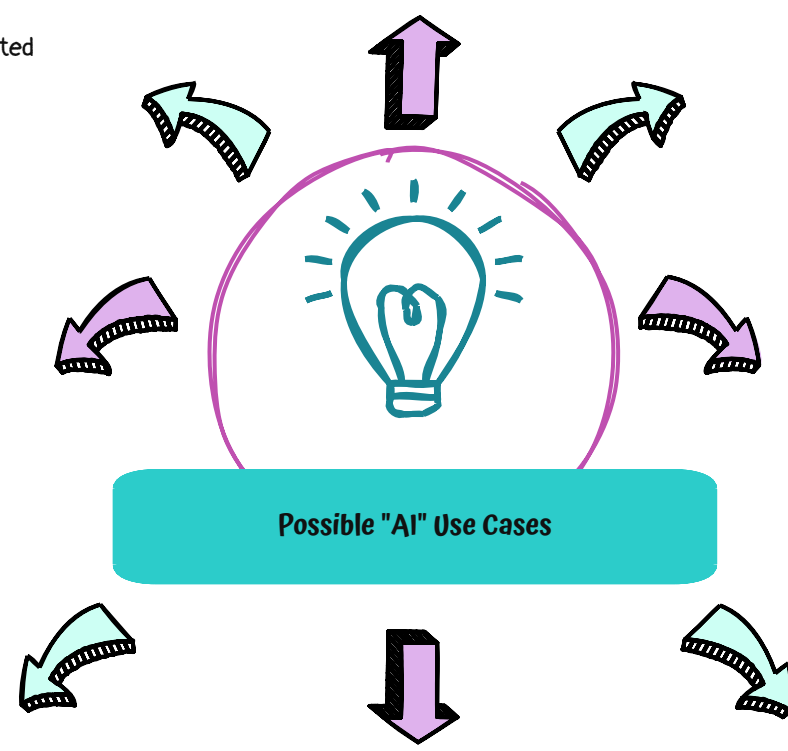
Access-to-Justice: Better Quality Applications

Some litigants are unable to cogently explain their factual situation in their court paperwork. Might it help to have Gen AI recommend improvements to the language (without embellishing facts)?

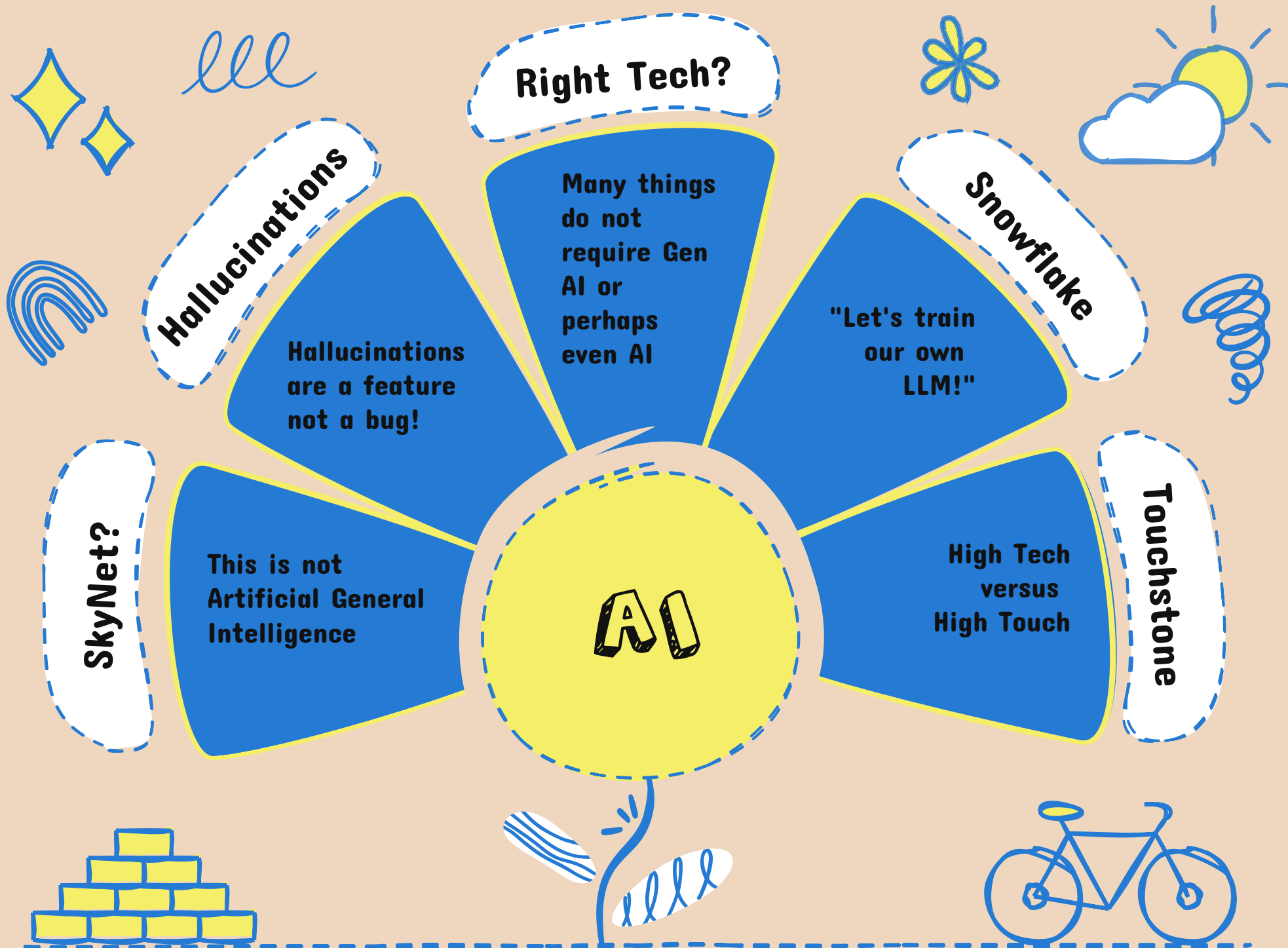

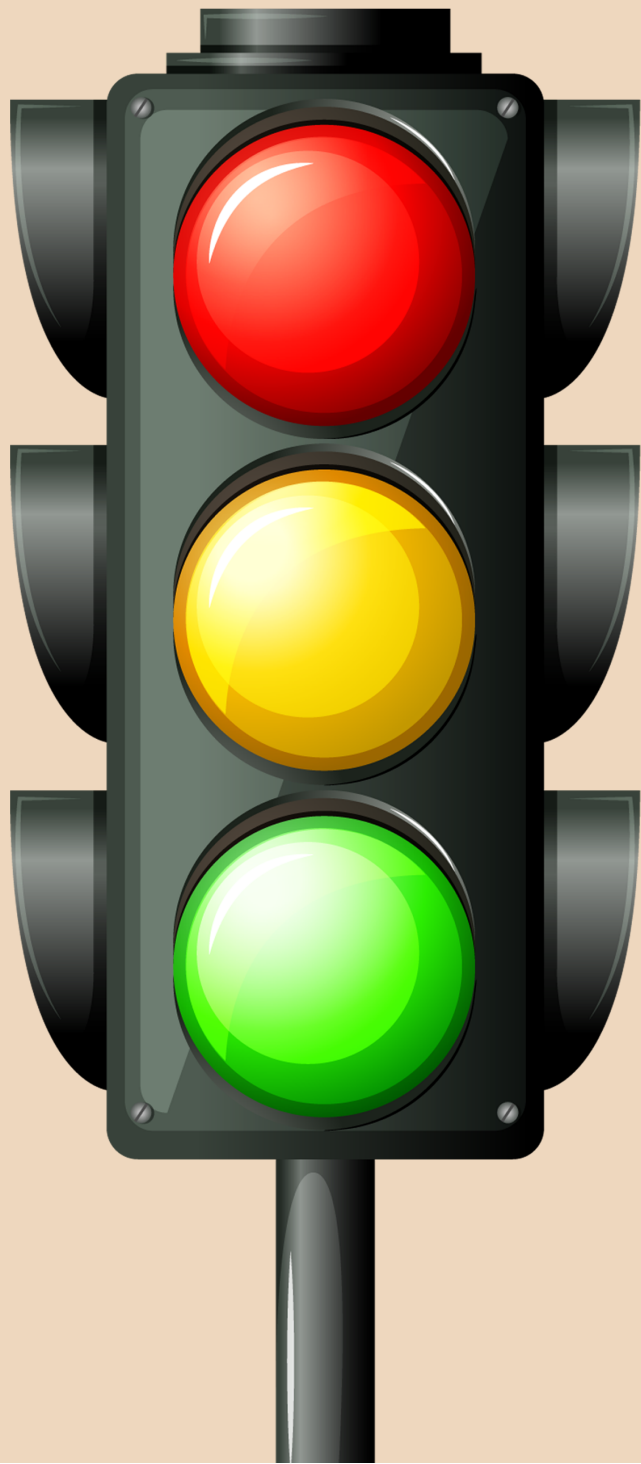
Legal Research: Getting Relevant Caselaw and Legislation before the Court
